(SDCL 12-2-2, 12-2-3) Ballots and election supplies must be delivered to the superintendent of each election precinct prior to the opening of the polls. (SDCL 12-16-18) No applications for absentee ballots, using an authorized messenger, may be honored by the county auditor after 3:00 p.m. on election day. Absentee ballots have to be returned to the county auditor in time for them to be delivered to the correct polling
August 20	location by the time the polls close. (SDCL 12-19-2.1) (Voter must be confined due to sickness or disability to use authorized messenger.) Last day for county canvass of returns for run-off election. (SDCL 12-20-36)
	Certified copies of the official county canvass for a run-off election must be filed with the Secretary of State immediately following the official canvass. (SDCL 12-20-38.1) (May be sent electronically and followed up with original in the mail.)
August 21	Last day for convening of state board of canvassers for run-off election. (SDCL 12-20-47) (Within seven days after the day of election)(SOS will notify auditors when state canvass is complete)
September 28	Deadline for County Auditor to transmit voter election history from the general election in Total Vote. <u>This date is not set in state law</u> but using <u>SDCL 12-4-37</u> as a guideline.

NOTE 1: At least five days shall intervene between publications which are to be done during consecutive weeks. (SDCL 17-2-17)

NOTE 2: Official notices may not be published on Sunday. (SDCL 1-5-2)

NOTE 3: When a deadline falls on a holiday, Saturday or Sunday, an act may be performed on the next business day. If the period of time prescribed or allowed is less than seven days, intermediate Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays shall be excluded in the computation. (SDCL 12-1-17)

NOTE 4: Be sure to include cost of publication in each notice. (SDCL 17-2-28)
